I have the honor to forward to you Army of the Tennessee Camp 64 Annual Report.

Army of the Tennessee Camp 64, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War had an outstanding 2019. Though still small, we continue to grow and are very active in service to our communities and promotion of Civil War education. A cadre of truly dedicated members has brought our Organization and the history of the American Civil War to people of all ages and backgrounds across several counties in Middle Tennessee and the Upper Cumberland Valley.

The Camp has provided for grave dedications in locations throughout Middle Tennessee and participated in Patriotic events in a variety of locations

The Camp has been generous with time and treasure well beyond what may be normally expected of a Camp of our size. We have provided direct financial support to wreaths across America and to Middle Tennessee State University's Heritage Center in Murfreesboro as well as to the Depot Museum in Monterey, Tennessee, supporting their Civil War preservation efforts.

All services we have performed have been at our own individual expense and for the good of our order, our communities and the preservation of our Civil War history. In addition we have supported the ROTC programs in various High Schools in Rutherford, Putnam, Overton and White counties. Members of Camp 64 have dedicated literally hundreds of hours to educational programs for elementary school children throughout all of middle Tennessee having contact with well over 2,500 students across a seven county area. We have provided support Franklin's annual Carter House March and from Murfreesboro to Monterey. **Every single one** of our members have provided support both in personal time, effort and treasure. Our membership currently stands at 14 with an additional applicants awaiting approval.
